IN THE UK

Every 10 minutes, someone is diagnosed with breast cancer.

That's around 55,000 women and 400 men every year.

Breast cancer is the most common cancer.

1 in 7 women will develop the disease in their lifetime.

1,000 people die from the disease every month.

And it's estimated that over 61,000 people are living with incurable secondary breast cancer.
