




Organising bingo is easy and you can hold it practically anywhere – from your school, to home or your workplace. Have fun, raise money and make life-changing breast cancer research happen.

How to play


- Choose how much you're going to charge people to play. This should be the same for everyone we suggest a £2 participation fee. Participants can play multiple rounds, but their total spend should not exceed £8.
- Print each player a bingo card (or 2), making sure that everyone playing has a different card.
- Use a random number generator to choose numbers from 1 to 75, or if you're really getting into the spirit of things, number some ping pong balls or pieces of paper
- Let everyone know to shout "bingo" if they're the first person to get a horizontal, vertical, and diagonal line, and finally a full house!
- Draw the numbers and play you can play just for fun or decide a small prize for each line and full house.


